These efforts reflect South City's commitment to unity, resilience, and innovation, ensuring our community continues to grow stronger, cleaner, and more connected.

#### PROGRAMS THAT EMPOWER EVERY GENERATION

From early learners to lifelong volunteers, South San Francisco continues to invest in programs that help residents learn, grow, and thrive.

Our Youth in Government program gave students hands-on experience in civic leadership, while expanded childcare programs created 120 new after-school spaces at no cost to families through the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program in partnership with the South San Francisco Unified School District.

At the other end of the age spectrum, the City adopted its first Age-Friendly Action Plan - a roadmap outlining clear objectives and measurable outcomes in nine domains of livability for older adults which includes Outdoor Spaces and Buildings, Transportation, Housing, Participation, Communication and Information, Respect and Social Inclusion, Civic Participation and Employment, Community Support and Health Services, and Emergency Services. Seniors also enjoyed expanded services with extended hours at the Roberta Cerri Teglia Senior Center, additional senior programs at the Alice Peña Bulos Community Center, and a growing list of recreation and enrichment opportunities targeted towards older adults. In addition, the twice per week congregate nutrition program continues to be in high demand with 8,000 meals being served each year.

South San Francisco is proud to be a community where cultures from around the world come together to create something uniquely ours. The City proudly celebrates diversity through events that bring neighbors together in the spirit of unity and pride such as this year's Cultura Fest.

This vibrant festival, championed by Mayor Eddie Flores, transformed Grand Avenue into a celebration of heritage, art, and community with a lively parade, local vendors, cultural performances, food, and an art show inside City Hall.

#### **KEEPING SOUTH CITY SAFE**

Our public-safety departments continue to set a high standard for professionalism and innovation.

The Fire Department responded to more than 8,400 calls and transported 5,000 patients this year. Crews completed a \$2 million upgrade to the department's training tower and introduced a 34-foot fire boat, named "Industrial," capable of delivering 200 gallons of water per minute.

The Police Department expanded its ranks with 15 new officers and 6 professional staff, fully implemented the Mental Health Clinician Program, and launched Citizen RIMS, an online transparency platform.

Coming soon: the City's first Drone as First Responder Program - a critical tool for real-time situational awareness and faster, betterinformed decision-making in public safety operations, and the HEAT Team focused on human-trafficking prevention.

In 2026, Police and Fire will co-host "Expanding the Blue and Red," a recruiting event encouraging more women to join public safety.

#### **BUILDING A CITY THAT LASTS**

South City's infrastructure improvements keep our neighborhoods safe, resilient, and ready for the future.

- \$5 million in street upgrades through the Pavement Management Program
- Two miles of protected bike lanes along Junipero Serra Boulevard
- 15 MPH school zones installed at 13 schools
- 220 LED streetlights upgraded along Grand and Linden Avenues
- 80 ADA curb ramps and a new accessible path at Cypress and Pine Park
- 80,000 passengers rode the Free South City Shuttle in this past year alone

At the Water Quality Control Plant, new biosolids processing technologies are saving rate payers \$100,000 annually in operating costs, while federal partners are investing \$11.5 million in critical wastewater infrastructure sealevel rise protections.

The upcoming Shoreline Protection and Connectivity Project, funded through state and federal grants, will safeguard our waterfront

> and connect trail networks for future generations.

## SUPPORTING BUSINESSES AND EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

South San Francisco continues to invest in South City's economic growth with programs like Launch Local, which is activating vacant storefronts for pop-up businesses and art installations, while the new Property-Based Improvement District (PBID) proposal moves forward.

This past February, the City drew nearly 1,000 attendees at the successful Lunar New Year Night Market. In June, the City and its partners promoted South City as a global biotech leader at the BIO 2025 conference in Boston.

## INVESTING IN A MORE AFFORDABLE SOUTH CITY

South San Francisco continues to make meaningful progress in expanding housing options and stability for residents. This year, the City secured \$890,000 through the state's Prohousing Incentive Program, approved an Affordable Housing Financing Plan, and regained control of 201 Baden Avenue to guide its future development. The City also increased the funding loaned to Rotary Gardens by \$2.3 million (for a total loan of \$4 million) and to the BRIDGE Housing PUC Site by \$362,000 (for a total loan of \$2.3 million).

Through partnerships with 13 community nonprofits, nearly 900 residents benefited from housing, health, and youth programs funded by the City.

The City also approved key housing projects like Rotary Gardens and Railroad Avenue Townhomes, which will provide new homes for seniors and families.

### What's up with Safeway?

Construction on the new Safeway at 190 El Camino Real and Spruce Avenue is making great progress. Developed by SteelWave, the 68,000-square-foot store will anchor a new retail and dining center, with completion expected in Summer 2026.

#### SPACES THAT BRING US TOGETHER

The Library | Parks and Recreation Center – the City's largest community center combining services from both departments under one roof – has received over 277,000 visits from more than 65,000 unique visitors in the past year!\*

This year, the Library hosted more than 2,000 programs and distributed more than 10,000 books through the Summer Learning Program.

On the Parks and Recreation side, construction progresses at Orange Memorial Park Aquatic Center, and design continues for Westborough Preschool, the new park at Linden Avenue and Pine Avenue, and the Dundee Park renovation. Projects in the works include added pickleball courts at Orange Memorial Park and design of Centennial Way Park North.

The Finance Department earned national awards for budget and financial reporting while maintaining South City's AAA bond rating. Implementation of the 2024 Measure W (Business License Tax) modernized the business license tax structure to support fair, long-term growth.

If approached by immigration officials, stay calm and do not run away. You have the right to remain silent and can use your Red Card to assert your rights.

This side is for ICE / Este lado es para ICE

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

These cards are available to citizens and noncitizens alike.
