The City of South San Francisco is pleased to announce the availability of funding through the Community Impact Funding Program, which consolidates multiple federal, state, and local funding sources—including but not limited to the Housing & Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), local Housing Trust Funds, Permanent Local Housing Allocation (PLHA), HOME Administrative Funds, and Economic & Community Development General Funds.

Funding will support eligible activities that provide direct benefit to low-income households and individuals residing in South San Francisco, consistent with City priorities related to affordable housing, homelessness response, public services, community development, and public facility improvements.

Funding Overview

The City will use a mix of local, state, and federal sources to fund community impact programs and funding will be allocated based on program eligibility, City priorities, and available revenues.

All proposals must be submitted online via City Data Services (<u>www.citydataservices.net</u>) by 4:00 PM on January 15, 2026. No paper submissions will be accepted. Additional guidance will be provided during the Technical Assistance Workshop scheduled for Tuesday, December 16, 2025 at 10:00 AM.

Eligibility Requirements

I. Funding Source Requirements

Projects must meet requirements applicable to the specific funding source(s) assigned, which may include federal, state, or local criteria. CDBG-funded activities must meet a national objective as defined by HUD and primarily benefit low- to moderate-income individuals (≤80% AMI). Applicants should consult the City's 2023–2027 Consolidated Plan for needs and priorities.

II. Eligible Program Areas

Programs funded under the Community Impact Funding Program may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Public Services: Programs improving quality of life for low-income residents, including youth, seniors, persons experiencing homelessness, survivors of violence, persons with disabilities, and other vulnerable populations.
- 2. Housing Services & Minor Home Repair: Activities increasing housing stability, safety, and habitability.

- 3. Community Development Activities: Projects that enhance accessible public facilities, community infrastructure, or support neighborhood improvement efforts (subject to funding source eligibility).
- 4. Fair Housing Services: Funded through HOME Administrative Funds and Housing Trust Funds. Applicants should hold HUD certification.

III. Eligible Applicants

- 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations
- Public agencies
- Organizations fiscally sponsored by a certified 501(c)(3)

IV. Service Area

Programs must serve residents of South San Francisco and, where applicable, be located within city limits.

V. Compliance

Applicants must comply with all applicable federal, state, and local requirements, including reporting, financial management, and performance standards.

Income Verification (For Income-Qualified Programs)

CDBG sub-recipients must verify income eligibility except when serving HUD-presumed low-income populations. Acceptable documentation includes tax returns, pay statements, benefit letters, and other proof of income. Records are subject to City monitoring.

HUD Income Limits

As determined by HUD, State of CA Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) and County of San Mateo.



The CDBG Subcommittee (two City Councilmembers) will evaluate proposals using published criteria. Review includes:

- 1. Staff evaluation for eligibility, completeness, and past performance
- 2. City Council public hearing on community needs
- 3. Subcommittee review and scoring
- 4. Final funding recommendations incorporated into the Annual Action Plan
