One Arrested for DUI During at DUI Check Point

South San Francisco, Calif.

The South San Francisco Police Department held a DUI Check Point on 8/16/2024, leading to one DUI arrest.

Two drivers were cited for driving with a suspended driver's license due to prior DUI arrests.

20 Drivers were cited for driving while unlicensed.

Most Californians consider drunk driving as one of their biggest traffic safety concerns, and drunk driving crashes accounted for nearly a third (33%) of all traffic deaths in the state in 2022. This equates to about four people killed every day.

First-time charges for DUI in California are an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, which could include a suspended license.

The South San Francisco Police Department reminds the public that impaired driving could be caused by more than just alcohol. The use of cannabis products, illicit drugs, even prescription and over-the-counter medications can lead to impairment.
